LEARNING LANDSCAPES Nurturing a child's relationship to land and learning

Learning Landscapes is the Feather River Land Trust's K-12 conservation and education program that connects children with the natural world, enhances place–based learning, and provides hands–on land stewardship experiences.

We conserve natural areas as "outdoor classrooms" within a 10-minute walk of every public school in the Feather River Watershed and support teachers and students to use them.

CONSERVE

We conserve and care for outdoor classrooms on campuses and natural areas next to public schools, making it easy for teachers to bring students outside to learn, play, and help care for the land.

ENHANCE

We install trails, signs, and seating areas on campuses and adjacent lands to create ideal outdoor learning environments.

SUPPORT

We train and support K-12 teachers to "Teach from the Land" and lead their students in hands–on restoration and land stewardship projects.
